I understand that as a community that we are all impacted in different ways and that we may have different ideas on how to deal with the changes and I personally would like to see how we can all work together to come to some sort of solution as to what to do.

I am a writer who has lived and worked from our home on Durand Drive for 16 years. I love our hills, I love our wildlife, I love our little village. But I have seen the canyon change a great deal since I first got here. I worry about the sharp increase in home robberies and mail theft, as well as the effect of increased tourism now straining the capacities of our 1920s infrastructure. As a Mom of 4, I also wonder about ways that our community can promote programming for families with young kids, as more and young families move in. I'd like to join the HHA board so I can stop worrying and wondering about our neighborhood, and instead take action to help protect the beauty, safety, and sense of community that brought all of us here in the first place.

**Cheryl Veltri**

My family and I have made Hollywoodland our home for over 25 years. We raised our daughter here and have always felt a part of the special community that is Hollywoodland. We are very proud of our historic neighborhood. We live in an area that was designed for an era where traffic was minimal, sidewalks were not planned, and fire engines were of a size capable of navigating the small curved streets; not so today. Coming together to address the safety issues and to preserve the historic heritage of Hollywoodland is of special concern to me.

While we welcome the tourists and hikers, we are challenged to find ways to better address the concerns of the community together. Safety and preservation of the historic character of the neighborhood is important for now and in the future.

I am committed to serving Hollywoodland to make a difference for the betterment of the entire community.

**Diane Murphy** resides near the top of Deronda and has had a 30-year career in government, public affairs, public relations, marketing and communications, specializing in aerospace, tech, renewable energy and politics. Her career began in Washington, DC as an aide to the leadership in the US Congress. Subsequently, she has run 30 political campaigns, served as a consultant to DOE and NATO (No. Atlantic Treaty Org), and was a SVP of three multi-billion-dollar aerospace corporations: Airbus, Northrop Grumman, and SpaceX. She feels the current lack of attention by the city puts both at great risk and that her experience in government and could prove beneficial toward a reasonable, long-term solution.

**Laura Davis**

Hollywoodland has been my home since 1987. As a young professional woman, I was drawn to the area's sense of community, which I found absent in other parts of the city, and its quiet proximity to Griffith Park. Like others, I have seen changes through the decades, many of them improvements. The beauty of our neighborhood has increased as younger people have moved in and restored its historic homes, there is a greater diversity among residents, and for the first time since I moved here, young children live on and add vibrancy to my block. Many of those kids will grow up here, and are a primary motivating factor in my commitment to restoring safety and a sense of peace to Hollywoodland. Toward that end, I have developed working relationships with members of CD4, DOT, Rec & Parks, the Mayor's office and LAFD, first by attending dozens of meetings with officials from those City agencies, and hosting get-togethers for neighbors at my home with members of the first three. In December 2016, I organized the first in a series of ongoing meetings between Councilmember David Ryu and his chief of staff Sarah Dusseault and a rotating group of HHA board members and interested residents. We may not get everything we ask for and the changes will be incremental, but it is important to let our elected officials know that we're engaged and in this together. My promise to members and all of my neighbors is that I will continue to be a tireless and knowledgeable advocate for Hollywoodland so that it remains the special place that drew us here.

**Robert Louis** I have lived on Deronda Drive for 22 years so I remember quite a different neighborhood. We've been discovered, so serving on the HHA Board for the past two years has been my way of trying to contribute to the well-being and preservation of our neighborhood. I served on the beautification committee and if re-elected will continue in that capacity or another as needed.
