Hollywoodland Homeowners Association will celebrate our 75th anniversary in 2017! Our purposes, objectives and conduct of governance have basically been unchanged since 1942. We continue to be advocates for your property, the preservation of its values and overall safety in our neighborhood. The HHA board of directors consists of 12 elected volunteers representing Hollywoodland. We also receive assistance from fellow neighbors who participate on committees and report on issues specific to certain areas.

What does the HHA do?

Our top priority is to ensure neighborhood needs are understood within the City by communicating weekly with our council office and other key departments on the issues we hear from our membership. We work hard to have current laws, codes and ordinances enforced in addition to interfacing with the City on developing new legislation (i.e. short term rentals, second dwelling units, party houses, emergency response).

We also handle maintenance and upkeep of the Village Green; host special events for the neighborhood; communicate neighborhood news thru monthly Newsletters and mid-month email blasts and support our Hollywoodland Design Review Board.

Your membership of \$65 annually ensures we can continue our charge and effectively bring about solutions to issues that impede safety, erode property values and detract from the quality of life in our community. In 2016 The HHA Board of Directors interfaced with city agencies communicating our neighborhood's position on:

- Public works issues
- Griffith Park Parking and Circulation enhancement plan
- Developed and articulated a solution to the tourist hiker issue at Toyon Canyon
- Advocated for a trilogy pedestrian gate at the end of Deronda/Mulholland using discretionary funds
- Requested mounted LAPD/rangers to patrol the neighborhood and park
- Opposed citywide planning proposals for Granny flats, short term rentals and Airbnb
- Opposed parking meters in the Hollywoodland Village
- Advocated DOT for bus service for Canyon Drive the only official entrance into the Hollywoodland Gifted Park section of Griffith Park
- Generated data for the Los Angeles Animal Control Wildlife Officer regarding coyote abuse
- Interfaced with FAA regarding sign and noise abuse
- Appealed the height and roadway approval for a new construction at 6068 Mulholland
- Analyzed, read and submitted comments on EIR's for the Griffith Park Circulation Plan and Hollywood Community Plan
- Interfaced with the city council office, various city departments and the district congressional office regarding a
 variety of issues affecting our homes and adjacent park land, particularly issues affecting the public safety and
 unauthorized entrances and vistas.
- Support slow growth measure S initiative

We also socialized and beautified our neighborhood with your monetary support including:

- A celebration Shakespeare's 400th birthday & the historic 1915 production of Julius Caesar in Hollywoodland
- Maintained, insured, planted and decorated the Village Green
- Participated/organized the holiday party and food drive, craft faire and Easter egg hunt
- New property owners' welcome party

Your dues underwrote and installed security cameras in the village to monitor crime, measure traffic/pedestrian usage, and monitor illegal vans and buses.

We have issued twelve newsletters and maintained a website.
