Mike Shull, General Manager of Recreation and Parks will retire After 30 years of service to the City of Los Angeles.

Mike Shull began his career in the City of Los Angeles in June 1990 as Civil Engineering Assistant for the Public Works Bureau of Engineering. Mike immersed himself in the project management of many large City capital projects centered on the Department of Recreation and Parks, where his knowledge and interest expanded with the challenges the City's park system faced. In 2005, he would join the City's Department of Recreation and Parks as the head of the Planning Division working on innovative design approaches to improve existing parks and increase access to open space. Since Mike joined RAP in 2005, the Department has added 74 new parks and expanded 14 others, adding nearly 700 acres of land while reducing potable water usage by approximately 50%. In 2013, Mayor Eric Garcetti appointed Mike as General Manager of the Department of Recreation and Parks to oversee more than 450 City Parks on over 16,000 acres of land, 1500 full-time employees, and manage a \$275M operating budget. Using data and technology, Mike implemented equity-based strategies and goals in both achieving gender parity while doubling youth participation in many recreation programs which culminated in a \$160M funding agreement with the 2028 Los Angeles Olympic and Paralympic Games to subsidize youth sports and fitness programs, removing cost barriers for participation in the City of Los Angeles lower-income areas. Some of Mike's key accomplishments include managing the Department during some of the City's most challenging fiscal years while expanding park access, increasing capital investment in low-income communities, achieving gender equity, improving RAP's emergency response services and completing very successful operational and capital improvements at the Greek Theatre. Mike plans to spend more time with his wife Cathy and sons Eric and Tom. Mike has been a friend and mentor to many of us in the Rec and Parks family. We thank him for his years of public service to the City and look forward to seeing him soon as a frequent visitor to Griffith Park!

- Construction begins the beginning of June on the back side of the **Old Zoo**. We will be removing the old chain link fence and replacing it with heavy metal fencing with the goal of keeping park patrons safe, reducing graffiti and curbing some of the criminal activity that occurs inside the enclosures.
- Anticipated road closure: Griffith Park Dr., from Travel Town to the Compost Facility will be closed beginning the second week of June. We are looking to eliminate cut- through freeway traffic during rush hour and speeding vehicles for the safety of pedestrians, cyclists and wildlife on this road. Golfers, picnickers and others will need to allow for extra time as using Zoo Dr. will be the only way to access Wilson Harding golf course, Boys Camp, picnic areas, Amir's Garden and the Compost Facility. We will post notification shortly, but this is just to alert you in advance to this closure.
- Masks are still required inside all park facility buildings.
- Bronson Caves remain closed due to falling rocks.
- Parkline is still suspended due to a nationwide driver shortage.
- Have you noticed the speed feedback signs along Crystal Springs? Please slow down. The speed limit in the park is 25 mph. LAPD has been issuing citations and will continue enforcement in the park.
- Visiting the Griffith Observatory? Take the DASH OBS and avoid the hassle of looking and paying for parking. The DASH OBS stops at the base of MT. Hollywood Rd. where you can depart on your hike to the Hollywood Sign or Mt Hollywood.
